# **Open House & Director Election** January 21, 2026

The Knox County SWCD board will have an election of directors at an Open House on Wednesday, January 21, 2026 for two positions to be filled starting March 1, 2026.

Any landowner or occupier of land in Knox County, age 18 or older, may vote. Elections will take place at the USDA Service Center from 7 a.m.-5:30 p.m.

# **SWCD Accepting Director Nominations**

The Knox County Soil and Water Conservation District is accepting nominations for three of five Director's positions, for a two-year term of office.

Elections will be held from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, January 21, 2026 at an Open House and General Election at the SWCD office, 233 South Soangetaha Rd, Galesburg, IL.

You are eligible to be a Director if you reside in Knox County or own land in Knox County. You must be of legal voting age.

The governing body of the SWCD consists of five elected Directors who shall be owners or occupiers of lands within the District. Their

purpose is to carry out, in the public's interest, the control/prevention of soil erosion, conservation of resources, and prevention of air/water pollution. Directors willingly give of their time to decide what natural resource and agriculture issues need to be addressed in Knox County, what action will be taken, and who is responsible for getting the work done. It is their duty to approve the budget for all funds, approve all payments made by the District, and provide for the annual audit. They have the responsibility for personnel management including job descriptions, performance standards, policies, as well as benefits, while providing direction, motivation, and guidance.

A Director will serve a minimum of a two-year term on the SWCD board, attend monthly board meetings, and participate and serve on committees. SWCD Directors also review, monitor, and supervise the finances, office personnel, and workload of the District; represent the SWCD, as time allows, at local, regional, state and national conservation affiliated events and meetings; and participate, as time allows, in regional and state affiliated organizations.

Selected nominees are required to prove eligibility by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, December 5, 2025 at the District office 233 S. Soangetaha Rd., Galesburg.



# **Featured Conservation Practice** Saturated Buffer—Saturated Filter Strip

Saturated Buffers/Filter Strips improve water quality by reducing the nitrate loading to surface water from subsurface drain outlets. A tile line through a filter strip is intercepted with a water control box and then ran parallel to the creek within the filter strip to reintroduce the tile water to the soil profile. When/if the soil is fully saturated, the tile water runs back to the water control box and out the existing outlet. This practice is a lower-cost option to improving water quality and it is minimally invasive to farming operations.

In conjunction with the Illinois Sustainable Ag Partnership (ISAP), the Knox County Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) is piloting a new conservation delivery model for tile treatment, or edge of field practices. This alternative delivery model will allow Knox County SWCD to identify, design, and install multiple edge of field practices in the northwest part of the county. Knox County SWCD will seek access permission from landowners, allowing the separate projects to be bid, awarded, and installed as one holistic project, resulting in

faster conservation delivery. Similar efforts in Polk County, Iowa resulted in over 50 practices installations in a single year!

In Knox County, this pilot grant is focusing on projects in the northwest part of the county (subwatersheds: Cedar Creek, South Henderson Creek, Henderson Creek and Pope Creek) for edge of field practices that target nitrate reduction. Practices include Saturated Buffers, Bioreactors, Drainage Water Management, and Constructed Wetlands. ISAP is covering these practices at 100% installation


A Saturated Buffer might work for you if you have

- ⇒ A well-defined ditch or stream channel
- A stream adjacent to flat land with 300 ft or more along the bank with elevation change of 3 ft or less
- Tile outlet(s) in this same area that drain at least 10 acres
- Organic matter of at least 1.2% in the top 2.5 ft of soil in this area.

If you are interested in this practice and your location fits in these sub-watersheds between Galesburg and Rio, you might be a good fit for the SWCD pilot grant. Diagram Courtesy Rachael Millage ISGinc.com




